THE PROBLEM



Nigeria is at a crossroads, fighting for its soul, identity, and future.

Anyone who carries even a drop of patriotism in their veins must feel the urgency. But concern alone is not enough. Endless criticism is insufficient.

The only way forward is through courageous action and audacious moves, not only to save Nigeria but to redirect it toward renaissance and re-Nationalization.

As a trainer, coach and business consultant focused on systemic problem-solving, I have reached a sobering conclusion: Nigeria's greatest crisis is not just corruption or security rather it is disconnection!

A disconnection between Nigerians and Nigeria.

Like a husband and wife who no longer understand each other, this disconnection means that many citizens no longer bring their best selves to nation-building. Even when a few make valiant efforts, the system or the majority often undermines those steps.

The symptoms of this disconnection are visible: corruption, mindless destruction, tribalism, apathy and systemic failure.

This problem would be manageable if not compounded by a deeper flaw: our education system.

While nations facing similar identity crises have used transformative education to rebuild their citizen identity, Nigeria has adopted a foreign curriculum that often disconnects our children from their roots.

By the time a child turns 13, they may know more about Abraham Lincoln, John F. Kennedy, or Winston Churchill than Tafawa Balewa, Hassan Katsina, Nnamdi Azikiwe or Obafemi Awolowo and the events that forged Nigeria.



This results in a generation that becomes "un-Nigerianized" too early, weakening patriotism and disconnecting identity from nationhood.

(Please do not misunderstand: there is nothing wrong with going global, but every form of globalization begins with localization.)

THE SOLUTION

There is no doubt that Nigeria's problems (complex and wicked), require multi-dimensional approaches some of which demand "wicked" solutions. But chief among them is reconciliation, a re-connection between Nigerians and Nigeria. This transformation must begin with:

- Honest self-evaluation
- National reorientation
- Emotional re-connection
- Forgiveness and healing

Civic education through storytelling, shared history and strategic dialogue.

It requires learning, unlearning, and relearning. Through conferences, summits, white papers, national dialogues, multi-generational orientation, inter-generational handshakes and more, we must rekindle national consciousness. But all of this can be very costly, demanding excruciating resources, energy and time.

But what if all of that could be simplified?

They have inherited the scars, but not the story.


- We owe them more than criticism.
